Yanapuma Spanish School is a well-organized and efficiently run language school. My experience superseded my expectations. I initially registered for 2 weeks of advanced Spanish classes during July of 2015, and extended my stay a third week, as I was so pleased with the level of instruction I was receiving. I was given a variety of options, and chose 1:1 instruction, four hours a day. The time flew. My highly capable instructor, Carina, incorporated music, poetry, stories, personal anecdotes, humor and art into our daily lessons, thus infusing my learning with the history and culture of Ecuador. The weekly gathering of students around the table to have a taste test, or "degustación", of typical/traditional Ecuadorian foods was another pleasurable entrance point into the culture. I arrived at Yanapuma a fluent Spanish speaker, yet my instructor discovered holes in my learning and helped me to plug many of those holes. My vocabulary has increased, my understanding of the subtleties of the language has deepened, and I am finally wrapping my mind around the complexities of the subjunctive tense! Yanapuma arranged a home-stay for me with the delightful Sra. Yolanda; having my Spanish experience extend beyond the school day to include the activities of home-life added to the fun and learning. I got to interact with more people, in Spanish, and enjoyed delicious home-cooked Ecuadorian and Venezuelan cuisine daily. I took advantage of Yanapuma's afternoon "Culture Class" where a teacher-guide led us to discover markets, churches, museums, archeological sites and restaurants. I also got to venture beyond Cuenca through the weekend excursions organized by the school. I highly recommend Yanapuma Spanish School to students, young and old, who want a holistic experience, challenging themselves to think and speak in Spanish, and to folks who've chosen to live in Ecuador and want to improve their Spanish to enhance their local experience.
